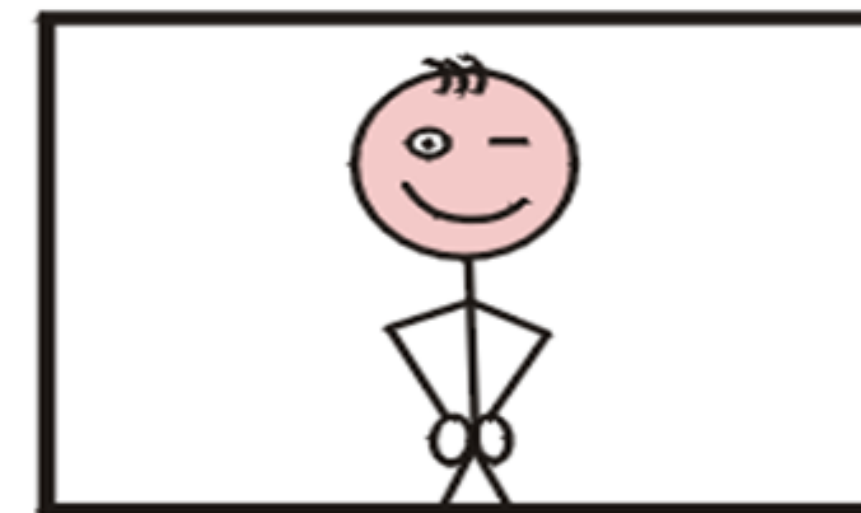

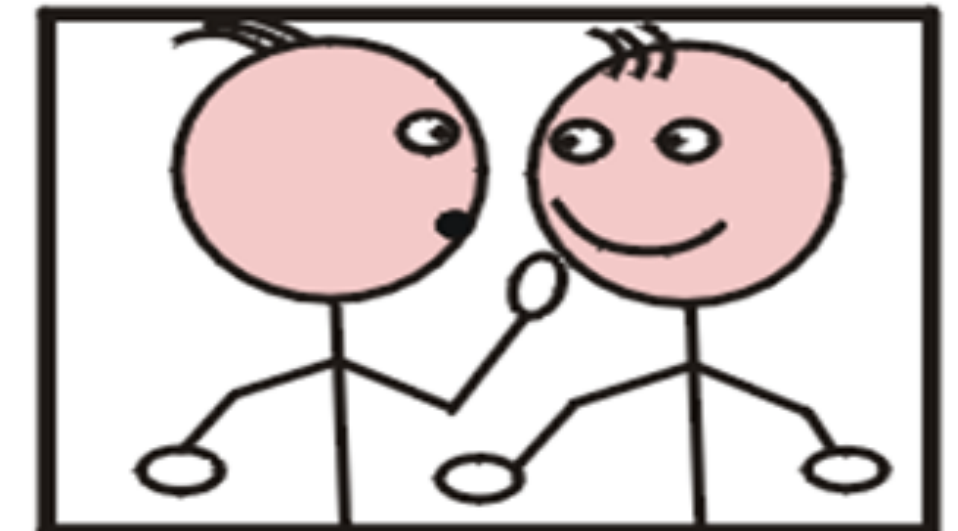

1. High Angle
2. Low Angle
3. Eye Level
4. Dutch Angle



LIGHTING

sets the mood, focus, and tone of the frame



High Key Lighting has few shadows



Low Key Lighting has shadowed and dark sections



High Contrast Light shows harsh bright and dark spots



COLOR

sets the mood, focus, and tone of the frame

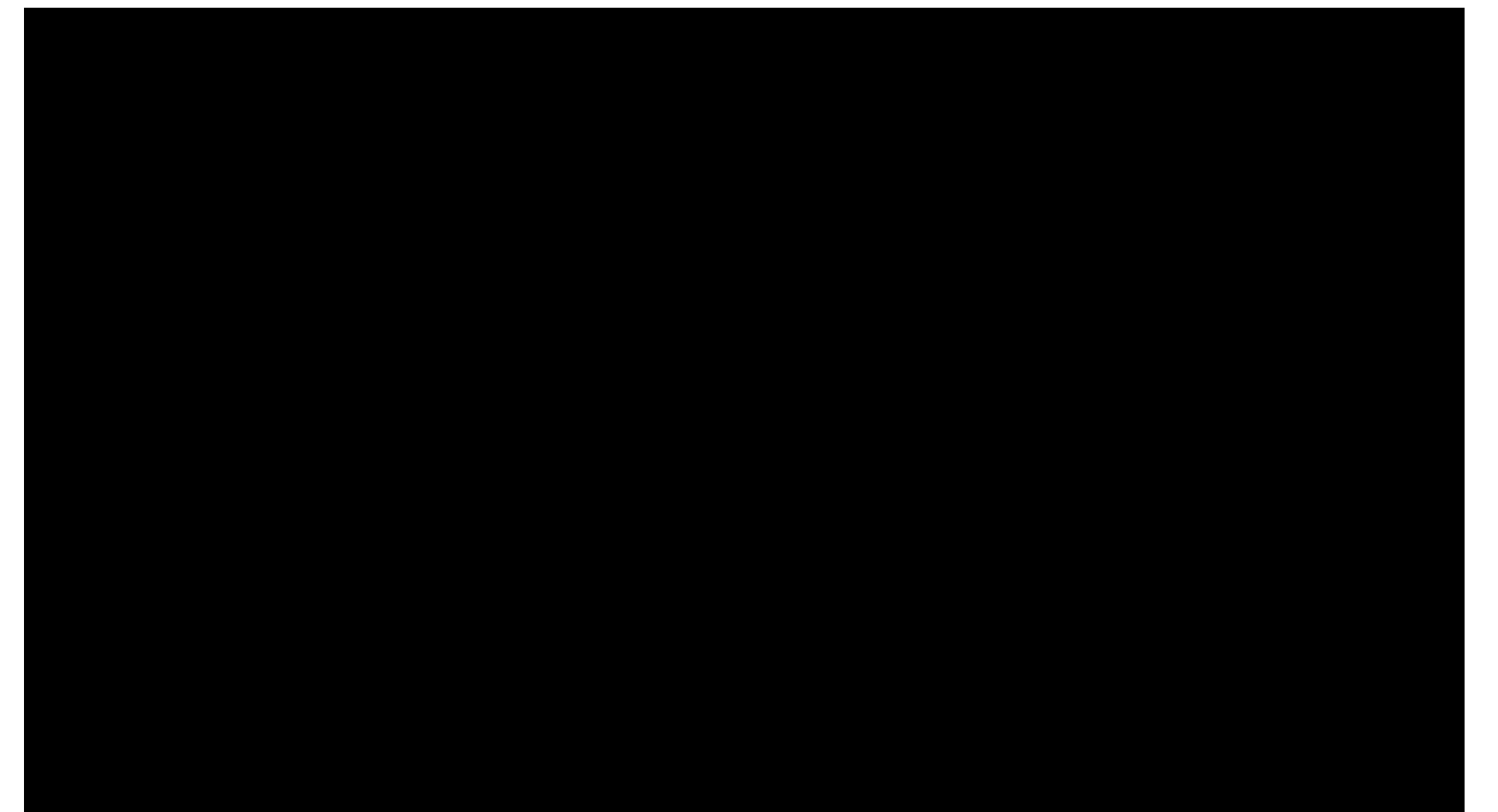
